Pedagogic/teaching methodology:

This module uses student-centered learning.

Scheduled learning includes lectures, discussions about the actual real life cases, and seminars in groups for applying problem solving techniques to solve real life issues which are given by lecturer. During lecture in the classroom, the lecturer gives the didactic question and creates a chance for students to deliver their though about specific case. Students are asked to adapt the critical thingking for solving health problem.

Students in the class are divided into groups. Each group will get a different topic to discuss and will present at each meeting.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with reading assignments, self-directed study for quiz preparation and discussion.

Assessments used:

Basic of Health Policy and Administration:

There are two types of examination:

- 1. Quiz (40%)
- 2. Assignment (60%)

There is no mid-term examination instead of students have a brief quiz and assignment every week. The final exam is general quiz with multiple choice questions, essays, and assignments.

Basic of Hospital and Primary Healthcare Administration:

There are three types of examination:

- 1. Middle examination (30%)
- 2. Final examination (30%)
- 3. Soft skills (40%)

Each examination takes 100 minutes includes multiple choice questions, essays and case studies. The examination assesses the students' knowledge and understanding and all learning outcomes of the module and students' analyzing skills.

Soft skills are assessed by lecturer and peer group in each meeting, such as:

- a. Basic interpersonal skill
- b. Communication skill
- c. Group skill
- d. Social skill
- e. Problem solving skill
