In this integrating experience, students will learn about definition, investigation, management, prevention and evaluation of outbreak and disaster and apply those.

A case study is used to learn how to arrange the health, nutritional and environmental programs for controlling communicable diseases, mental and reproductive health problems in refugees.

The students are divided into small groups. Each group has to discuss the topic determined by the lecturer and to present the results to the class.
